

**MINUTES**  
**SIXTH TAXING DISTRICT, City of Norwalk**  
**COMMISSIONERS' MEETING**  
**March 2, 2011**

In the absence of the regularly scheduled monthly Commissioners' Meeting for March, 2011, an informal meeting was held immediately following the Annual Meeting and the Annual Budget Meeting on March 2, 2011.

Andy Conroy brought up the subject of the disposition of the property known locally as Old School Field and by the City of Norwalk as Old Witch Park. At some time in the past, it is believed that the Commissioners sent a letter to the City of Norwalk that the District waived their right to Witch Park. Mr. Conroy said that the Charter of the Sixth Taxing District requires the electors to affirm any real estate transaction proposed by the Commissioners. Since that wasn't done when the Commissioners waived their right to that parcel of land in question, Mr. Conroy thinks that the waiving of that right is null and void. Mr. Conroy maintains that, in order to get along with the city, the Commissioners gave up the rights of the 6<sup>th</sup> District to this property in error. This matter needs to be looked into and, possibly, in relation to the dispute over a few properties that were arbitrarily moved out of the Sixth District and into another district by the City Tax Assessor's office. Mrs. Langalis said it sounds as if the letter that was setd would by null and void. Mr. Igneri said that we may have an opportunity to go into negotiation over this property. Mr. Avery suggested that, if the District wants the property back, we should sit down with the city and negotiate ownership. The issue will require further research.

Pam Nielsen, 32 Briar, spoke of some difficulties for handicapped commuters at the Eastbound side of the Rowayton Railroad Station. She said that there is a big cement piece near the ramp that must be stepped over making it very difficult for a handicapped person. Mr. Robson was asked to look into the problem.

John Cagnina, 36 Vanderbilt, expressed concern about the dog park. He was wondering how much it cost the district and whether using funds for the use of an exclusive group is appropriate. Mr. Cagnina was assured that the dog park people not only donate money to pay for the collection bags but they collected all the money for the materials to build the new fence around the park. No money is being spent by the district to support the park.
