

1. After having been approached by several individuals wishing to conduct various types of exercise classes at Bayley Beach, the Commissioners have come up with some regulations governing these fee- or donation-based groups. The beach will open at the usual time in the morning, i.e. 7 a.m. There will be no classes in the evenings. The District will ask \$250 per month from any entity as well as requiring Liability Insurance. These guidelines will be in place as an experiment to see how things progress. Any income generated by these groups will be used for improvements at Bayley Beach.
2. After hearing a letter from Joe Gallo, the Bayley Beach concessionaire, the Clerk will write a letter to WPCA to ask that the late penalty be waived from the grease trap violation incurred at the concession stand. Mr. Gallo will provide the District with a Certificate of Liability Insurance before he opens for the season.
3. The Commissioners will be speaking with representatives of Shakespeare on the Sound to express some of the concerns nearby residents have regarding sound from the rehearsals and the productions.
4. Commissioner John Igneri announced that the Commission has hired a new insurance carrier. A review of the coverage and value of District property is underway.
5. The Commissioners gave permission for the Brien McMahan faculty to hold their annual end of year party at Bayley Beach on June 28, 2010.
6. The Commissioners reiterated their intention of hiring Doggie Do Not to rake Pinkney Park prior to Memorial Day weekend.
7. After Dick Schock, one of our railroad guards, noted increased bike usage at the Rowayton Station parking lots, the Commissioners asked Ed Carlson to place an unused bike rack at the station lot.
8. After coming out of Executive Session, the Commissioners approved a change in the reimbursement for medical insurance premiums. The District will reimburse full time employees for 60% of their insurance costs not to exceed \$15,000. This is a change from the present cap of \$9,000.
