Music Together – for Pre-School Children, Thursday Morning, January 14 @ 10am & 11am

Music Together (pre-school) – two sessions. Child development researchers recommend mixed-age groupings because they foster natural family-style learning. Younger children enjoy watching and imitating older ones; older children learn by leading younger ones; and adults are happy because the children in the family can go to class together. Each child participates at his or her own level in singing, moving, chanting, listening, watching, or exploring musical instruments. The class provides a variety of adult-child activities that are fun and offer new ways to play musically at home. Any caregivers, singly or together, can bring the children—parents, grandparents, nanny. The whole family is welcome for this essential family music experience. Registration is requested.
